What is a Little Free Library? Little Free Libraries are free book exchanges (you know, those little wooden boxes full of books) in front yards and public spaces around town. In 2009, Madison was one of the first cities to adopt them. There are now over 250 in the city and Dane County.

HOW CAN I PARTICIPATE?

1| Join Little Free Library co-founder Todd Bol and help build 4 Little Free Library book exchanges! Following kits with step-by-step instructions, you'll work with fellow volunteers, hone your carpentry skills and build 4 Little Libraries to be donated to local organizations.

2| Bring a book to stock Little Free Libraries around Madison. There will be hundreds of FREE books on site to peruse, so bring a few to share or pick up a few to take home.

3| Bike and share books. Stop by the event, choose one of several bike routes we've mapped out around Madison and distribute books to Little Free Libraries along the way. No bike? Visit a Madison BCycle stand nearby, or you could walk, jog or drive these routes, too.

This event is FREE and open to the public. No previous experience is required; all ages and skill levels are welcome.
