St. Paul, MN (June 5, 2025) – The Little Free Library (LFL) nonprofit organization is pleased to announce the recent appointment of four members to their national board of directors: Jeff Tobler, Azanique Rawl, Patrick McCarthy and David Hawn (pictured above, left to right).

Jeff Tobler of Los Angeles is Vice President of Global Media Relations and Influencer Marketing for Expedia Group Brands and was previously the Chief Marketing Officer for filmmaker Ava's DuVernay's narrative change collective ARRAY. Prior to ARRAY, Tobler spent a decade at Warner Bros. Worldwide, served at The CW Network and its predecessor, The WB, and started his career at NBC Entertainment. Tobler is a graduate of Columbia College Chicago. He currently serves on the board of ARRAY.

Azanique Rawl of Charlotte, North Carolina leads Vanguard's community and crew experience with a focus on creating new embedded engagement strategies for US crew members.
